Lesson #2: [medium]

- 1. Students listen once take notes.
- 2. Give out questions: Set 10 minutes for students to answer questions from notes
- 3. Listen again students answer the questions as they listen
- 4. Give extra 10 minutes to consolidate answers
- 5. Feedback answers (give out answers or go through on board)

Lesson #3: [easy]

- 1. Give out questions students have <u>5-10 minutes</u> to look at questions
- 2. Students listen and answer questions
- 3. Give 3 minutes to tidy notes
- 4. Students listen again check answers and answer questions missed
- 5. <u>5-10 minutes</u> to tidy answers
- 6. Feedback answers (give out answers or go through on board)
