Lesson Plan

1. Activate schemata – what do you know about plagiarism at university?

2. Try to elicit key vocabulary:

plagiarism / academic offence / sources / paraphrasing / referencing / complete copying / collusion / misrepresentation / proofreading / writing mills / prove.

3. Read out the text 2 times at normal speed & students take notes.

4. Students construct the whole text in pairs / threes.

5. Teacher Feedback – check with the student's copy.

6. Noticing skills – ask students to highlight the gerund (-ing form as a noun). Then highlight all key terms connected with plagiarism.
