Aim: to develop the students' ability to discuss contemporary problems / situations and to analyse and evaluate the effectiveness of their solutions.

Level: ***** [B1/ B2/C1/C2] Lesson Time: 1-2 hours

Speaking Tasks (analysis & Evaluation)

1. Basic overview

- i. Put students in small groups (groups of 4s or 5s).
- ii. Hand out seminar phrases (if needed) to aid the fluency of the discussion. https://academic-englishuk.com/wp-content/uploads/2017/04/Seminar-phrases-AEUK.pdf
- iii. Explain to the students that they are going to have a discussion and try to come to an agreement on a suitable solution(s).
- iv. Give out a task card to each group (good idea! give out the same topic card to each group for a more focused discussion and feedback session).
- v. Give the students 20-30 minutes.
- vi. Students discuss the key information on the card and one person takes notes.
- vii. Optional: After they have finished their discussion they prepare a short presentation on their observations / findings from the discussion.
- viii. Optional: All the students give a short presentation to their class on their findings and possible solutions.
 - ix. Repeat with a different task.
