Lesson Plan

Lead in

- Ask Students to read the 'title' and predict the content of the lecture.
- Ask students to write down key terms & language from the discussion.
- Feed in / check key vocabulary.

Three types of lesson

Lesson#1: [hard]

- 1. Students listen once & take notes.
- 2. Give 5 minutes to tidy notes.
- 3. Listen again & add to notes (use a different colour pen).
- 4. Distribute questions set 20-25 minutes to answer.
- 5. Feedback: distribute or project answers.

Lesson #2: [medium]

- 1. Students listen once & take notes.
- 2. Distribute questions: set <u>15 minutes</u> for students to answer the questions from their notes.
- 3. Listen again. Students answer the missed questions as they listen.
- 4. Give extra 10 minutes to consolidate answers.
- 5. Feedback: distribute or project answers.

Lesson #3: [easy]

- 1. Distribute questions. Students have 10 minutes to look at the questions.
- 2. Students listen & answer the questions.
- 3. Give 5 minutes to tidy answers.
- 4. Students listen again. Check answers & answer missed questions.
- 5. <u>5-10 minutes</u> to tidy answers.
- 6. Feedback: distribute or project answers.
