

Nouns (Countable, Uncountable, Singular & Plurals)

Lesson plan

<u>Aim</u>: To help students understand and use countable, uncountable, singular and plural nouns correctly.

<u>Time</u>: 60 minutes & homework task.

<u>Delivery:</u> This lesson can be delivered face-to-face or online. For online delivery, each worksheet could be placed in a class document on OneDrive.

Lead in

- Distribute worksheet 1. Students ask & answer questions in task 1.
- Feedback: nominate a few students to give their answers.
- Feedback: distribute or project the **writing criteria** for your course if you have one. Point out where nouns are assessed (broad range of language, accurate language use etc.).

Job sharing

The idea of job sharing is not new, but in the last ten years, it has begun to increase steadily in many European countries. The reason for this growth is largely attributed to the larger concept of flexible working. Job sharing entails one role shared between two or more people, allowing for employees to work part-time or reduced hours. The surge in demand for flexitime could be due to a staff member's age, family commitments or simply maintaining a healthy work-life balance, especially if someone has other responsibilities such as volunteering or charity work. From an employer's perspective, job sharing can be beneficial when a valued member of the team would like to work fewer hours but their knowledge and expertise cannot be easily replaced. A newer employee could then work alongside the more experienced staff member, who in turn, would pass on his or her set of skills. In addition, job share partners are required to provide coverage for each other's sick leave and holidays, which in turn, eases the pressure on the employer to find a replacement at short notice.
