EXAMPLE

Aim: To help students understand and be able to reference accurately.

Time: 90 minutes & homework task.

<u>Delivery:</u> This lesson can be delivered face-to-face or online. For online delivery, each worksheet could be placed in a class document on OneDrive.

Lead in

- Distribute or project worksheet 1. Students complete task 1: discussion.
- Feedback¹: nominate one or two students to answer.

Noticing

- Task 2: students read the paragraph & highlight the references.
