

Paraphrasing 2 **EXAMPLE**

Aim: To help students understand and be able to paraphrase effectively.

Time: 60 minutes & homework task.

Delivery: This lesson can be delivered face-to-face or online. For online delivery, each worksheet could be placed in a class document on OneDrive.

Lead in

- Distribute or project **worksheet 1.** Students complete **task 1:** definition & importance of paraphrasing.
- Feedback: nominate one or two students to answer.
- Distribute or project your course criteria and indicate where paraphrasing is assessed.

Noticing

- **Task 2**: students compare an original and paraphrased text and identify paraphrasing strategies.
- Feedback: distribute or project worksheet 1 task 2 ANSWERS.

Guided Practice

- Distribute or project **worksheet 2.**
- Option 1: students complete tasks 1-5 individually, in pairs or small groups.
- Feedback: distribute or project worksheet 1 tasks 1-5 ANSWERS.
- Option 2: students complete each task individually, in pairs or small groups.
- Feedback: distribute or project ANSWERS before students move onto the next task.
- Distribute or project worksheet 3. Students complete task 1: sentence level paraphrase.
- Feedback: distribute or project worksheet 3 task 1 ANSWERS.
- Distribute or project worksheet 4. Students complete task 1: paragraph level paraphrase.
- Feedback: students do peer feedback using the provided checklist and/or distribute or project **worksheet 4 task 1 SAMPLE ANSWER**.

Freer Practice

- Students select a topic from their subject, research and select an article, choose a paragraph and paraphrase the selected section.
- Teachers take in and mark. Use our error correction code.

Homework

- Students paraphrase another paragraph from their chosen article.
