

# **Note-taking Methods 2**

#### **EXAMPLE**

<u>Aim</u>: To provide students with practice in a range of note-taking strategies and methods to use when listening to lectures.

Time: 60 minutes & homework task.

### Lead in

- Distribute or project **worksheet 1.** Students complete **task 1:** discussion.
- Feedback: nominate one or two students to share ideas.
- Students complete **task 2**: abbreviations and symbols.
- Feedback: distribute or project worksheet 1 task 2 ANSWERS.

### **Guided Practice**

- Distribute or project worksheet 2.
- Students look at example of linear notes (task 1), complete listening and note taking exercise (task 2) and then compare with a partner and the model notes.
- Distribute or project worksheet 3.
- Students look at example of the spider gram (task 1), complete listening and note taking
  exercise (task 2) and then compare with a partner and the model notes.
- Distribute or project worksheet 4.
- Students look at example of the table (task 1), complete listening and note taking exercise (task 2) and then compare with a partner and the model notes.
- Distribute or project worksheet 5.
- Students look at example of a combination of methods (task 1), complete listening and note taking exercise (task 2) and then compare with a partner and the model notes.

#### **Freer Practice**

- Students listen to a longer lecture on 'fast fashion' & take notes (worksheet 6 task 1).

- Students do peer feedback of the notes. Use the included checklist & key points of lecture.
