

## **Common Tenses in Academic Writing EXAMPLE**

<u>Aim</u>: To support students in their understanding, use and practice of the four most common tenses in academic writing.

**<u>Time</u>**: 60 minutes & homework task.

**Delivery:** This lesson can be delivered face-to-face or online. For online delivery, each worksheet could be placed in a class document on OneDrive.

#### Lead in

- Distribute or project worksheet 1. Students complete task 1: paragraph analysis.
- Feedback<sup>1</sup>: nominate one or two students to share ideas.
- Feedback<sup>2</sup>: distribute or project worksheet 1 task 1 ANSWERS.

## **Guided Practice**

- Students complete **task 2:** identify the errors.
- Feedback<sup>1</sup>: nominate students to answer.
- Feedback<sup>2</sup>: distribute or project worksheet 3 task 2 ANSWERS.


