Lesson: lecture listening

Lesson Aim:

To focus on one key topic and develop a range of key academic skills based on this topic.

Introduction [5 minutes]

- Introduce the topic 'Fast Fashion'.
- What does fast fashion mean?
- Do you buy a lot of new clothes?
- Do you ever think carefully about how these clothes are made?

Option 1


