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# **Describing Paintings**

How to describe works of art using a range of English phrases

**EXAMPLE** 

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### **Teacher's Notes**

**Aim**: To give students practice describing paintings using phrases for general description, style and technique, colours and mood, and interpretation.

Time: 60-90 minutes

### Introduction

• In pairs/groups, students briefly discuss a famous painting they like.

### Task 1: Artistic Styles

• Read about different artistic styles and take notes.

### **Task 2: Definition Matching**

- Match definitions with styles.
- Feedback: share/distribute ANSWERS.

### **Task 3: Language Phrases**

• Read through language phrases, check unknown words.

### **Task 4: Describing Paintings**

- Study five paintings and use phrases to describe them.
- Feedback: share/distribute ANSWERS (includes expert analysis of the paintings).

### Differentiation

- Students work on one painting at a time with ANSWERS given after.
- Or each student studies one of the five paintings, then shares their description in groups.
- Or in groups study one painting and share findings with another group.

### **Task 5: Describe a Famous Painting**

• Students select a famous painting of their choice and describe it using the phrases.


