

Language Phrases for Describing Paintings

When describing paintings, we usually focus on four areas: general description, style and technique, colours and mood, and personal interpretation. Below are useful English phrases for each.

1. General Description

This painting shows / depicts / portrays...

2. Talking about Style & Technique

It was painted in the [Renaissance / Impressionist / Cubist / etc...] style.
